Introduction

We recognise these unacceptable practices have no place in our business or supply chain. This statement outlines our commitment to identifying, preventing, and addressing modern slavery.

Datagraphic isn't required to comply with Section 54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015. Still, as an SME committed to responsible business practices, we take this matter seriously. As evidence of this commitment, we, therefore, self-elect to publish this statement in accordance with the Modern Slavery Act 2015.

Here we document Datagraphic's steps taken in the financial year 1 January to 31 December 2022 to understand potential modern slavery risks to our business, and the measures we have in place to ensure no slavery or human trafficking in our operations.

Datagraphic is a secure document automation partner to numerous public sector organisations and enterprises. We specialise in automating critical outbound and inbound mail processes. Our cloud-based software solutions and secure UK document processing centres quickly and safely let clients outsource and automate the manual and repetitive tasks associated with printing, mailing, digitally sending and responding to their customer, employee and supplier communications.

There are two operational businesses within the group. Datagraphic Group Limited, with head office responsibilities and inbound mail processing at Chesterfield, Derbyshire. Datagraphic Limited, the secure UK production centre in Rugby Warwickshire. There are ~100 people employed across the two sites.

This statement applies tor Datagraphic Limited and Datagraphic Group Limited (Hereafter referred to as "Datagraphic").

Slavery and Human Trafficking

Policy Statement

We encourage the reporting of any suspected cases of modern slavery. All reports will be investigated promptly and thoroughly. Whistleblowers will be protected from retaliation.

Continuous Improvement

We are committed to continually improving our practices to prevent modern slavery. Annually we review our policies and procedures to ensure their

effectiveness.

Communication

This statement is available to all employees, suppliers, partners, and the public

on our official website. We aim to foster open communication regarding our

efforts to combat modern slavery.

Compliance and Review

This policy complies with the requirements of the Modern Slavery Act 2015.

We will review and update it in line with our financial year to reflect changing

circumstances and best practices.
